Words from Fr Brendan Clover

Dear friends,

As I sit down to write this we have today said our goodbyes to John Scammell after his untimely and unexpected death. But what a 'send off' it was, and a lovely social gathering to follow. I would like to thank everyone who worked so hard today and I know that Janet and the family join me in this. What a loving and hard-working parish this is!

During the Funeral service these words from 1 Corinthians were read. 'Now we see a dim reflection in a mirror; but then we shall be seeing face to face. The knowledge that I have now is imperfect; but then I shall know as fully as I am known.' Paul here is talking about our destiny, the reason God made each and every one of us, that in the end we shall see him face to face, and know him as we are known by him. That is Christian anthropology in a sound bite!

And that anthropology we rehearsed liturgically during Holy Week. What wonderful liturgies we enjoyed, and what a wonderful preacher. If you missed it, you missed a treat, no several treats. Huge thanks from me to everyone working behind the scenes to make all of that happen, not least our Sacristan and Head Server, Martin, and the flower arrangers, and the readers, and the choir, and the caterers. This Sunday our attention turns to 'doubting Thomas'. I hope I can find something helpful to say about him!

It is important that we accept the whole message that comes to us from the Word of God this Second Sunday of Easter, which is called 'Divine Mercy Sunday.' Christ has taught us that 'man not only receives and experiences the mercy of God but is also called 'to practise mercy towards others: "Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy" (Mt5:7). It is the Spirit who heals the wounds of the heart, pulls down the barriers that separate us from God and divide us from one another, and at the same time, restores the joy of the Father's love and of unity.' (Blessed Pope John Paul II)

This is the call to be loving and merciful. May we find it in our hearts to be so, to model this behaviour, and be agents of transformation in our community.

Art Installation

Our artist writes:

For those who were not able to go up to the large cross, this is what you would have seen if you had. Everything that was on the cross when Christ was crucified was represented. At the top, a sign in Hebrew saying "Jesus the Nazarene. King of the Jews" and just below it, a crown of thorns.

Below these you would have seen a blood stained loin cloth along with a Roman hand spear which had been thrust through the cross. Nailed on each arm of the cross were two loaves of bread, and at the foot, a bottle of wine. The bottle has been nailed on. It drips wine into a bucket. The bread and wine represent the body and blood of Christ. The art piece was created to emphasize the importance of communion and to encourage onlookers to get closer to Christ's violent death.....a sacrifice made for us because he loved us and a request from him to "do this in remembrance of me".

This is the last week. Only the bread and wine remain on the cross. It still drips into the bucket. Thrown on the floor around the bucket you can now see the shroud. His body has gone. He has risen.

The idea for the bleeding cross, titled, **communifixion**, came to me over 20 years ago. It was due to be placed in St Mary's church in Aylesbury, Bucks, but a series of events made it impossible to deliver. I shared the idea with my wife Jane last Christmas and she encouraged me to ask Father Brendan. He said yes.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Father Brendan for allowing me to place the cross in St Johns church and for believing in the concept. And finally, a big thank you to all who attend the services for your patience over the weeks.

Finally, if you have not yet got close to the cross, I hope you make the short journey to the bleeding cross this Sunday, because next week, it will be taken down.

Wells Cathedral Parish Pass

You may have seen in the news last week, that Wells Cathedral has announced changes to its admission guidelines with free passes for parishioners in the Diocese of Bath and Wells and local people, and a new entry charge for tourists.

Entry remains free to enter for worship, prayer, and to light a candle and free passes are available for parishioners in the diocese. Information about the Parish Pass and how to apply for it is available from the Wells passes section of the Wells Cathedral website. You will note that the application form for a Parish Pass does require a signature from a churchwarden or incumbent.

St John's 100 Club

The 100 club is an easy way you can help raise money for St. Johns. It only costs £12 per year (equivalent to £1 / month) and you will be entered into a drawer every month with a chance to win a prize.
