

Words from Fr Brendan Clover

Dear friends,

I write this before I set out to vote. Politics has been dominating the headlines. But I've got a confession to make. I've been scrolling past these headlines on the hunt for topics that are more up my street.

I'm speaking to myself when I say it's important to return to the fundamentals. Whether you have loved the election coverage or not, it's a privilege and a responsibility to have the right to vote. As followers of Jesus, it's a way in which we join in his redemptive work, pursuing a means of governance that reflects his kingdom values and enables the flourishing of those around us. And that means we need to get informed, thinking wisely and prayerfully about which issues and policies will direct our votes. What God cares about is what we should care about. And his priorities transcend left-versusright party politics. He commanded humankind to 'work' and 'take care' of the land (Genesis 2:15), to 'administer true justice', 'show mercy and compassion', and to 'not oppress the widow, the fatherless, the foreigner, or the poor' (Zechariah 7:9-10).

I know I need to think about these issues. Which policies will best align with God's pattern for human flourishing by celebrating good, punishing evil, pursuing peace, and protecting the oppressed? And which leaders would we be wise to submit to? Because ultimately, unless it directly contradicts biblical commands, we're called to obey and honour human governance (Romans 13:1–2). .../cont

Once the new government is in place let every conversation be seasoned with grace. Let's avoid tribalism. Let's be open to hearing other perspectives. Because, under Christ's rule, there's no place for militant arguments with your friends and family or political slurs in the office. Finally, join me in praying for the new government: for wisdom in decision-making, for stability in our land, for good and honest governance with integrity, and policies that enable the flourishing of all.

Wells Cathedral Parish Pass

You may have seen in the news, that Wells Cathedral has announced changes to its admission guidelines with free passes for parishioners in the Diocese of Bath and Wells and local people, and a new entry charge for tourists.

Entry remains free to enter for worship, prayer, and to light a candle and free passes are available for parishioners in the diocese. Information about the Parish Pass and how to apply for it is available from the Wells passes section of the Wells Cathedral website. You will note that the application form for a Parish Pass does require a signature from a churchwarden or incumbent.

St John's 100 Club

The 100 club is an easy way you can help raise money for St. Johns. It only costs £12 per year (equivalent to £1 / month) and you will be entered into a drawer every month with a chance to win a prize. Over the last 15 years the 100 club, has raised over £12,000 for the church and has paid out almost £8,000 in prizes. 


The Evangelist Gin


