

Dear friends,

I want to use my space in this newsletter this week to encourage you to attend the Glastonbury Pilgrimage this year. Here's the timetable: Saturday 13th July 12.00 noon: Solemn Concelebrated Mass sung in the Nave of the Abbev Church Preacher: The Rt Revd. Dr Rowan Williams For 30 minutes after Mass there will be stations for the Sacrament of Anointing, and confessions will be heard in a suitable location. Locations will be announced on the day. Lunch 3.00 pm: Procession of the Blessed Sacrament to the Abbey for Solemn Benediction in the Nave of the Abbev Church Preacher: The Reverend Ben Andrews, Vicar of St Theodore's. Port Talbot This is the Centenary Pilgrimage hence the eminent preacher. The plan is to share in this event with our sister parish, All Saints Weston-Super-Mare, and to enjoy a picnic lunch together in the Abbey grounds. We have investigated the costs of a coach and minibuses, but they are prohibitively expensive, so car sharing is the proposed means of transport. At the back of the Church from this Sunday you can sign up to attend. We will then pre-order Service Booklets which guarantee fast-track entry to the Abbey Grounds. The cost for the day is £11, children under 16 are free. We will then, nearer the time, organize travel arrangements. Wells Cathedral Parish Pass


You may have seen in the news, that Wells Cathedral has announced changes to its admission guidelines with free passes for parishioners in the Diocese of Bath and Wells and local people, and a new entry charge for tourists.

Entry remains free to enter for worship, prayer, and to light a candle and free passes are available for parishioners in the diocese. Information about the Parish Pass and how to apply for it is available from the Wells passes section of the Wells Cathedral website. You will note that the application form for a Parish Pass does require a signature from a churchwarden or incumbent.







"Sacred and Profane"

Tudor composers in praise and play

'Quintus and Friends' present a concert by some of the greatest composers from the Golden Age of English Music. Such illustrious names as Tallis, Byrd and Gibbons are placed alongside Philips and Tomkins, and the concert will feature some of the finest church anthems from the most glorious period in English musical history. Alongside 'Hosanna to the Son of David' (Gibbons) is Tomkins 'When David heard that Absalom was slain' – one a paean of joy and welcome, the other unspeakable grief portrayed in music.

But the very same composers were equally adept in the secular or profane world, and the second part of the programme will feature madrigals by the same composers and others from the same period.

The singing group 'Quintus' emerged in the dark days of Covid, when a group of five very fine singers – missing their usual singing – decided to meet socially just to sing through unaccompanied repertoire. As six were then allowed to meet, they asked Martin Firth to oversee rehearsals, and so 'Quintus' was born. Then and now, they meet occasionally for their own enjoyment, but have been prevailed upon occasionally to face the public. When they have done so they have sometimes expanded their repertoire to include works requiring more than five voices – hence they are joined by 'friends'.

Entry is FREE to this concert – June 15th, 7pm at St. Andrew's Parish Church, Chew Stoke, but we hope that exit will be by way of a (hefty) donation to the 'Jessie May Trust: Children's Hospice at Home'. Please bring some cash if you can.


