

Words from Fr Brendan Clover

Dear friends,

Firstly, this week, an encouragement to attend, or at least to hold in your prayers, our Bishop Paul, who will be welcomed into his role as an Assistant Bishop in the Diocese, at Evensong in the Cathedral Church of St Andrew on Sunday 14 April at 3pm. I know some of us are intending to be there. Because of this there will not be Evening Prayer at St John's at 5.30pm.

Next week I am taking my post-Easter holiday from Monday to Friday inclusive. I am grateful to Frs. Robert and John for covering the Thursday and Friday Masses. The Monday and Wednesday evening Masses will not happen in my absence. This Sunday we have the APCM at All Saints Weston-Super-Mare and I am grateful to Fr Robert for celebrating and preaching. We also have a visiting organist with us for the first time, Martin Firth, with whom I worked many years ago in my Bristol Cathedral days. Do please make him welcome! Sunday's gospel is set in the evening of Easter Sunday. The two disciples journeying to Emmaus have now hurried back to Jerusalem and report to the community of disciples that they recognized the Risen Lord 'in the breaking of bread'. Then suddenly Jesus himself is in their midst. The same person it is stressed - 'It is I indeed'. Now no longer bound by space and time but Lord of all space and all time. 'The Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end', as we proclaim at the consecration of the Paschal Candle at the Easter Vigil. A bodily presence, not a ghostly one: he eats food with them and invites them to touch him. And yet there is no expectation of his returning to his earthly public ministry. It is taken that he has moved into a new sphere of existence. There is both continuity and yet radical newness.

We tend to talk about the Resurrection, but this is misleading shorthand for the Resurrection of Jesus of cont/...

Nazareth. We are not just talking about a concept of life after death but proclaiming this person. But being this person makes it also a matter of universal impact, 'a new creation'. It is 'in Christ' that all things are to be made new and, as the gospel tells us, it is in Christ's 'name', his power and his presence, that the communion and mission of Christians is to be lived out.

At every Mass, as we celebrate the sacrifice of his passion and death, his resurrection and ascension, we have the elements of the scriptures, the sacramental meal, the real presence of Christ, fellowship/communion and empowering for mission. So too here as St Luke is leading us into the transition into the acts of our apostolic Church, we have had the heart-warming scriptures opened, the recognition in the breaking of bread and eating of fish, the bodily presence of Jesus and the fellowship communion and mission redirected 'and the pledge of future glory given to us'.

May that glory be ours and may God bless you as Eastertide continues.



Wells Cathedral Parish Pass

You may have seen in the news, that Wells Cathedral has announced changes to its admission guidelines with free passes for parishioners in the Diocese of Bath and Wells and local people, and a new entry charge for tourists.

Entry remains free to enter for worship, prayer, and to light a candle and free passes are available for parishioners in the diocese. Information about the Parish Pass and how to apply for it is available from the Wells passes section of the Wells Cathedral website. You will note that the application form for a Parish Pass does require a signature from a churchwarden or incumbent.

St John's 100 Club

The 100 club is an easy way you can help raise money for St. Johns. 
