

Wells Cathedral Parish Pass


You may have seen in the news, that Wells Cathedral has announced changes to its admission guidelines with free passes for parishioners in the Diocese of Bath and Wells and local people, and a new entry charge for tourists.

Entry remains free to enter for worship, prayer, and to light a candle and free passes are available for parishioners in the diocese. Information about the Parish Pass and how to apply for it is available from the Wells passes section of the Wells Cathedral website. You will note that the application form for a Parish Pass does require a signature from a churchwarden or incumbent.


The **Evangelist** Gin

Soaked in fresh lemon peel, it makes for an easy to drink G&T or enjoyed neat with plenty of ice.




Fund Raise as You Shop

"Sacred and Profane"

Tudor composers in praise and play

'Quintus and Friends' present a concert by some of the greatest composers from the Golden Age of English Music. Such illustrious names as Tallis, Byrd and Gibbons are placed alongside Philips and Tomkins, and the concert will feature some of the finest church anthems from the most glorious period in English musical history. Alongside 'Hosanna to the Son of David' (Gibbons) is Tomkins 'When David heard that Absalom was slain' — one a paean of joy and welcome, the other unspeakable grief portrayed in music.

But the very same composers were equally adept in the secular or profane world, and the second part of the programme will feature madrigals by the same composers and others from the same period.

The singing group 'Quintus' emerged in the dark days of Covid, when a group of five very accomplished singers – missing their usual singing – decided to meet socially just to sing through unaccompanied repertoire. As six were then allowed to meet, they asked Martin Firth to oversee rehearsals, and so 'Quintus' was born. Then and now, they meet occasionally for their own enjoyment, but have been prevailed upon occasionally to face the public. When they have done so they have sometimes expanded their repertoire to include works requiring more than five voices – hence they are joined by 'friends'.

Entry is FREE to this concert – **Sunday**, **June 16**th, **4.00pm** at St. John the Evangelist Church, Queen's Road, Clevedon, but we hope that exit will be by way of a donation to the 'Jessie May Trust: Children's Hospice at Home'.
