Words from Fr Brendan Clover

Dear friends,

On Sunday we welcome as celebrant and preacher the Rt. Revd, Michael Langrish, and we will be keeping the Feast of SS Peter and Paul. St. Peter and St. Paul are two of the most wellknown saints and are often spoken of as the two men most responsible for spreading the Christian message in the days of the early church. As to why they are celebrated on the same day, legend has it that they were executed on the same day under the command of Emperor Nero and buried in Rome. (Although historical accounts cite Peter being martyred in 64 AD and Paul in 67 AD.) Because of his Roman citizenship, Saint Paul was beheaded. St. Peter was reportedly crucified upside down because he said he was not worthy to be sacrificed in the same manner as Christ. On June 29 (moved by one day this year), the Church celebrates the feast day of both men, and as early as 258 AD, there is evidence of an already-lengthy tradition that both Saint Peter and Saint Paul were celebrated on the same day. "Both apostles share the same feast day, for these two were one; and even though they suffered on different days, they were as one. Peter went first, and Paul followed. And so we celebrate this day made holy for us by the apostles' blood. Let us embrace what they believed, their life, their labours, their sufferings, their preaching, and their confession of faith."

sermon in the year 395, St. Augustine of Hippo said


VOLUNTEERS PLEASE!

Wells Cathedral Parish Pass

You may have seen in the news, that Wells Cathedral has announced changes to its admission guidelines with free passes for parishioners in the Diocese of Bath and Wells and local people, and a new entry charge for tourists.

Entry remains free to enter for worship, prayer, and to light a candle and free passes are available for parishioners in the diocese. Information about the Parish Pass and how to apply for it is available from the Wells passes section of the Wells Cathedral website. You will note that the application form for a Parish Pass does require a signature from a churchwarden or incumbent.

St John's 100 Club

The 100 club is an easy way you can help raise money for St. Johns. 

It has been a privilege and honour to serve the parish of St John's and I could not have done this without the support and patience of Kevin and Hannah.





We are happy to write a card to accompany the flowers so that we can all celebrate with you during our daily services.




Fund Raise as You Shop
