Words from Fr Brendan Clover

Dear friends,

Next week our two parishes make a pilgrimage to the Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham and the Holy House of the Annunciation. All Saints arrive on Monday and depart Thursday, and St John's arrive Thursday and depart Sunday. I am hoping that in the future we have one pilgrimage attended by members of both parishes. Please know that you will be being prayed for at the Shrine and if there are specific people you would like to be remembered there please let me know.

This means that next week the Monday and Wednesday evening Masses will not take place and we are grateful to John Andrews for stepping in on Thursday and Friday.

May I draw your attention once again to the arrangements for the weekend on 1,2,3 November when All Saints has its patronal festival?
On Friday 1st November there is a Solemn Mass at 7pm followed by cheese and wine. On Saturday 2nd November there is a Solemn Requiem Mass at 10.30am. Two semi-professional choirs are singing at these Masses, so they will be a musical treat, and an opportunity to hear music in the context for which it was composed.

On 3rd November Bishop Michael joins us for a parish celebration of All Saints at 11am, with a bring and share lunch afterwards, and Evensong and Benediction at 2.30pm. There will only be a said Mass at St John's that day at 5.30pm. In May the tables are turned and we will invite the parish of All Saints to join our Patronal Festival. Please do everything you can to support this new venture. Finally on Monday 4th November Clevedon Choral will sing Faure's Requiem at 7pm as we remember the departed of this parish and our own loved ones. All Saints' Day and the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed on All Souls' Day both celebrate this mutual belonging. All Saints' Day celebrates men and women in whose lives the Church as a whole has seen the grace of God powerfully at work. It is an opportunity to give thanks for that grace, and for the wonderful ends to which it shapes a human life; it is a time to be encouraged by the example of the saints and to recall that sanctity may grow in the ordinary circumstances, as well as the extraordinary crises, of human living. The Commemoration of the Faithful Departed celebrates the saints in a more local and intimate key. It allows us to remember with thanksgiving before God those whom we have known more directly: those who gave us life, or who nurtured us in faith.

Wells Cathedral Parish Pass

You may have seen in the news, that Wells Cathedral has announced changes to its admission guidelines with free passes for parishioners in the Diocese of Bath and Wells and local people, and a new entry charge for tourists.

Entry remains free to enter for worship, prayer, and to light a candle and free passes are available for parishioners in the diocese. Information about the Parish Pass and how to apply for it is available from the Wells passes section of the Wells Cathedral website. You will note that the application form for a Parish Pass does require a signature from a churchwarden or incumbent.

Our fund-raising gin is now ready to buy!


Developed in conjunction with The Clevedon Distillery, made and bottled for
